Promoting a suicide attempt is a class E felony.

Under this act, the average daily attendance of a student who is enrolled full-time in the Missouri Course Access and Virtual School Program shall be calculated as if such attendance equaled the host district's or charter school's average attendance percentage for the previous year. Host districts that enroll one or more full-time virtual school students shall receive an amount of state aid specified in the act for such students on a monthly basis. The act provides that students who reside in Missouri may enroll in the virtual program of their choice. Provisions of current law regarding a school district's approval of a student's request to enroll in a virtual program shall not apply to full-time virtual program enrollment. The act requires host districts to adopt student enrollment policies for full-time virtual students and allows virtual schools to mutually agree with resident and host districts on the services that the resident district might offer, including possible financial reimbursements

for those services. For students with disabilities, the enrollment policy shall ensure the development of an individualized education program and related services agreement, as necessary. The act also specifies that student progress reports are necessary only for part-time virtual school program enrollees. The act requires a student's parent or guardian, if the student is not considered homeless, to apply for enrollment directly with the full-time virtual program. Finally, the act provides that a host district may contract with a provider to perform any required services involved with delivering a full-time virtual education.

If the population is not named, the population is not eligible for MO HealthNet during that fiscal year. Another appropriation cannot be used to make MO HealthNet payments for the population. The appropriation of funds is at the discretion of the General Assembly. It has the right to not appropriate funds or to appropriate funds in any amount for this population separate and apart from funds for other MO HealthNet populations. Any population is only eligible during a fiscal year if an appropriation is made during that fiscal year. Service and provider reimbursement will only be given if an appropriation for the service or provider type has been given for the fiscal year. The state cannot provide payments, reimbursements, or add-ons for services provided to non-MO residents. It specifies that individuals who have a mental disability, a serious and complex medical condition, a physical, intellectual, or developmental disability that impairs the ability to perform at least one activities of daily living task, or a determination by the Social Security Act or the Department of Social Services of total or permanent disability are exempt from MO HealthNet work and community engagement requirements. It also gives examples of good cause reasons the Department of Social Services can use to exempt someone from the work and community engagement requirements. One reason is having a disability under federal law and not being able to meet the requirements due to the disability. Another is having a family member with a disability in the home and not being able to meet the requirements because of the family member's disability. The Department of Social Services will make reasonable

accommodations so individuals with disabilities can participate in the work and community engagement requirements.

Any licensed nurse may terminate without consequence his or her participation in a patient's care if the nurse is subject to assault or battery by the patient

or an individual acting on behalf of the patient; provided the patient is of sound mind or is otherwise intoxicated at the time of the assault or battery. The health care facility shall be responsible for assigning a new nurse, as needed, to that patient until care is terminated. An individual who expresses an intent to harm themselves, who is not in need of emergency medical attention, and who has been charged with a criminal offense and is in the custody of a law enforcement officer shall first be evaluated at the nearest appropriate prison or jail. If admission to a hospital is recommended following the evaluation and an inpatient bed is available at an accepting hospital, then the individual may be transported to the accepting hospital. Evaluations under this provision may be conducted through telehealth. A health care facility that violates the provisions of this act shall be subject to license or registration revocation or suspension. Accrediting entities that violate the provisions of this act shall not be recognized as valid accrediting entities by any agency or department of this state.
