Legislative Education Project



The purpose of the Legislative Education Project (**LEP**) is to educate and motivate individuals by providing opportunities to become active in creating positive public policies for people with disabilities.

LEP at the Capitol provides the opportunity to receive updates on disability-related bills, attend committee hearings, and meet with legislators. It is facilitated by GCD staff who are knowledgeable on disability legislation.

LEP on the Road brings the LEP presentation to you. We can come to your office, meeting, center for independent living, or event.

The **LEP at the Capitol** is a one day experience that will be offered upon request to organizations or groups on Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the legislative session.

The **LEP on the Road** is a one to two hour presentation. It will be offered upon request on Mondays and Tuesdays during the legislative session.

Both programs require a ten person minimum.

The LEP is provided at no charge. Participants are responsible for their own food, travel, and lodging expenses.
