

Beginning January 1, 2019, any individual may open a savings account and designate the account as a first-time home buyer savings account to be used to pay or reimburse a qualified beneficiary's eligible expenses, as defined in the act. This act also creates an income tax deduction for taxpayers who make contributions to such savings account. The deduction shall be in an amount equal to fifty percent of the taxpayer's contribution to the account. The deduction shall not exceed the taxpayer's Missouri adjusted gross income for the tax year the deduction is claimed, and shall not exceed \$800 or \$1,600 for married individuals filing jointly. An account holder shall designate a beneficiary of the account no later than April 15 of the year following the tax year in which the

account was opened. The maximum amount an individual may contribute to an account in a single tax year is \$1,600 for an individual or \$3,200 for a couple filing a joint tax return. The maximum amount of all contributions to an account for all tax years is \$25,000. An account shall not contain more than \$50,000. The title of any home purchased with moneys from an account may not transfer for at least two years, absent reasonable circumstances. Moneys withdrawn from an account shall be subject to recapture if at the time of withdrawal it has been less than one year since the first deposit in the account, or if the moneys are used for any purpose other than those specified in the act. No financial institution shall be required to designate an account as a first-time home buyer savings account in its contracts or systems, to track the use of moneys withdrawn from an account, or to report any information that it is not otherwise required to by law. The income tax deduction created by this act shall sunset December 31, 2024, unless reauthorized by the General Assembly.

This bill removes housing related discrimination provisions from the Missouri Human Rights Act and establishes the "Missouri Fair Housing Act" for such claims. The Missouri Human Rights Act as amended applies only to employment and public accommodation discrimination claims. MISSOURI FAIR HOUSING ACT The repealed provisions of the Missouri Human Rights Act relating to discrimination in housing practices are reenacted in substantially the same form as part of the Missouri Fair Housing Act, Sections 213.150 to 213.188, RSMo. The bill provides that certain housing practices are unlawful if taken because of a person's race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, disability or familial status. The term "because" is defined to mean that the protected criterion was a contributing factor in the adverse decision or action. The Missouri Commission on Human Rights has jurisdiction to eliminate and prevent discrimination in housing practices. Any person who willfully violates an order of the commission is guilty of a class C misdemeanor. An aggrieved person may file a complaint of discrimination in housing practices with the commission, or file a civil action in circuit court to seek damages and other relief.

The state preempts the field of regulating the use of hand-held electronic wireless communication devices by motor vehicle operators and the provisions of this bill shall supersede any local laws, ordinances, orders, rules, or regulations enacted by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision to regulate the use of hand-held electronic wireless communication devices. No person under the age of 18, or with an instruction permit or intermediate

license regardless of age, shall use an electronic wireless communications device, whether it's handheld or handsfree, except to contact emergency services. The bill specifies penalties for various violations of the bill's provisions.
