HB 506 Carter

Creates the Every Child Can Learn Act to require turnaround options for certain underperforming schools, create personalized learning plans for certain students, address student promotion, and require letter grades for public schools

Only the reading intervention portion is below.

The bill requires, beginning July 1, 2020, all public schools in any metropolitan school district, including charter schools, to use a response-to-intervention tiered approach to reading instruction for any student determined by his or her school to be a struggling reader. Annually, beginning on January 1, 2020, each public school in any metropolitan school district, including charter schools, must prepare a personalized learning plan for any kindergarten or first grade student whose most recent school-wide reading assessment result shows the student is below grade level. Certain exceptions from this requirement are specified in the bill. Any student who is not reading at the second grade level by the end of second grade may be promoted to third grade only if the school provides additional reading instruction during the summer and demonstrates the student is ready for third grade at the end of summer school.

HB 631 Rone

Creates the Alternative Disability Services Act

This bill allows parents, guardians, and students who are age 18 or older to negotiate an agreement with the public school to allow another provider to work with a student with a disability when goals are not being met, accommodations are not being provided, or services are not being provided by certified individuals. It specifies the role of the public school in the agreements.

HB 646 Rowland

Modifies provisions relating to sheltered workshops

This bill requires that beginning July 1, 2018 the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education shall pay each sheltered workshop \$21 for each standard work week worked by an employee with a disability. The sheltered workshop will receive a percentage of the amount based on how many hours are worked by any employees with disabilities who are employed less than a thirty-eight hour work week or less than a six hour work day. **Status:** 1/24/19 Second Read (H)

HR 19 Unsicker

Urges state entities to engage in practices that encourage disability inclusion

This resolution urges state agencies to engage in practices to increase options for competitive, integrated employment and to become model employers. It also urges local educational agencies to facilitate a free appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment.

This act provides that if, preceding the date of injury or death, an employee who is on active duty as a first responder is diagnosed with a mental impairment and such person was not previously diagnosed such an impairment, then the impairment shall presumptively be considered an occupational disease and shall be presumed to have arisen out of and in the course of employment. This presumption may be rebutted by the employer or insurer. One or more compensable mental impairment claims arising out of a single accident shall constitute a single injury. Furthermore, a mental impairment shall not be considered an occupational disease if it results from a disciplinary action, work evaluation, job transfer, layoff, demotion, promotion, termination, retirement, or similar action taken in good faith by the employer. **Status:** 1/22/19 Introduced and First Read (S)

HB 663 Messenger

Modifies provisions regarding prosthetic and orthotic devices

This bill adds orthotic devices to the list of what health insurance companies are required to cover. It also states insurance plans must pay for a prosthetic or orthotic device if it was preapproved when the individual had insurance coverage with the plan even if the individual no longer does.

Modifies provisions for MO HealthNet coverage for incarcerated individuals

This bill temporarily suspends the MO HealthNet benefits of anyone who is incarcerated and reinstates the benefits upon the individual's release.

This bill requires that each polling location have at least one electronic voting machine available for use by individuals who are blind or have low vision during statewide, general assembly, and local elections. Any costs accrued for the additional use of the machines during these elections will be paid by the state but are subject to appropriations. This bill does not require that voters must use the machines.

HB 50 Bangert Issue 1

Prohibits anyone from using a hand-held electronic wireless communication device while driving a noncommercial motor vehicle unless the device is equipped for hands-free operation and is being used in that manner

HB 68 Dinkins Issue 1

Prohibits the use of a hand-held wireless communications device within a school zone **Status:** 1/10/19 Second Read (H)

HB 74 Tate Issue 1

Prohibits the use of hand-held electronic wireless communications devices while driving non-commercial and commercial motor vehicles; but allows the use of such devices when used hands-free by operators of non-commercial motor vehicles who are fully licensed and eighteen years of age or older **Status:** 1/10/19 Second Read (H)

Allows Missouri driver's license applicants to elect to have a medical alert notation placed on the person's driver's license

HB 659 Shields

Requires the Department of Mental Health and the Department of Social Services to apply for a Medicaid waiver program

This bill requires the Departments of Mental Health and Social Services to apply for a Medicaid waiver to assist those who are under age 18, have a physical and a developmental disability, and are in an institution or are at risk of being placed in an institution.

SB 261 Nasheed Issue 2 Provides that lawful consumption of medical marijuana shall not render a person ineligible for TANF benefits Status: 1/16/19 Introduced and First Read (S)

SB 303 Riddle

Licenses persons performing radiologic imaging or administering radiation therapy and establishes the Missouri Radiologic Imaging and Radiation Therapy Board of Examiners

After January 1, 2020, this act requires licensure by the State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts in order to perform radiologic imaging or radiation therapy procedures on humans for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes. The act authorizes the Board to establish licensure and scope of practice standards for any person performing nuclear medicine technology, radiation therapy, radiography, and radiologist assistant procedures and to limited x-ray machine operators. This act creates the Radiologic Imaging and Radiation Therapy Advisory Committee, which shall guide, advise, and make recommendations to the Board in matters relating to radiologic imaging and radiation therapy. The Board has the power to: promulgate rules for the issuance of licenses, charge and collect fees, promulgate rules for the denial, suspension, revocation, or refusal to renew a license, create alternative licensure requirements for remote areas of the state, and other actions as described in the act. A person who violates any provision of the act shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor. The Board may assess a civil penalty after factors set forth in the act are considered. Someone currently engaged in the practice of radiologic imaging and radiation therapy may be exempted from the licensure requirement, if he or she complies with specific requirements as described in the act.
