This bill allows a service-connected disabled veteran to receive a tax credit up to \$3,000 for obtaining a medical marijuana dispensary license for his or her business. The amount of the tax credit will be adjusted after the 2020 tax year.

The MO HealthNet Division will issue a provider update at least twice a year to outline treatment and utilization principles for providers. MO HealthNet participants will be allowed to continue using medications on which they are stable or that they have utilized successfully in the past if new policies or clinical changes are made. **Status:** 2/11/19 Second Read (H)

Requires marital and family therapists to complete two hours of suicide management training as a condition of licensure

Prohibits anyone from using a hand-held electronic wireless communication device while driving a noncommercial motor vehicle unless the device is equipped for hands-free operation and is being used in that manner
