## SB 890 Koenig

Creates the Alternative Disability Services Act

This act creates the Collaborative Special Services Agreement Act. The act allows a parent, guardian, student who has reached the age of majority, or a public school to initiate the request for an agreement that special education services or supplementary aids be provided by a privately contracted, appropriately state certified provider. The public school is prohibited from discouraging or prohibiting a parent, guardian, or student who has reached the age of majority from negotiating or consenting to such an agreement. Costs related to the services or supplemental aids shall not be discussed as a part of the negotiation of such an agreement, and any contract for services or materials related to such

agreements shall be approved by the school board. The terms of such an agreement may include provisions for partial or full enrollment of the student in the public school, and the services and supplementary aids the public school will provide. Such agreement may continue until the end of the student's annual Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Individualized Services Plan (ISP) cycle, and may be extended or modified with agreement from the parent, guardian, or student who has reached the age of majority, and the public school. An agreement may be initiated when a student may not have advanced appropriately toward attaining the annual IEP goals, when the IEP or ISP accommodations or modifications have not been provided, or when special education and related services may not have been available from licensed or appropriately state certified personnel through the public school. The education of students with disabilities shall, to the maximum extent appropriate, be with students who do not have disabilities, and such students shall attend regular classes, except in the case of a disability resulting in violent behavior which causes substantial likelihood of injury to the students or others. The public school must provide to parents, guardians, or students who have reached the age of majority information regarding where special education services, related services and supplementary aids may be obtained, the public school's criteria for such services, and the public school's criteria under which the services and supplementary aids are obtained.

This bill specifies anyone under 18 years old must wear a helmet anytime they are driving or riding a motorcycle or motortricycle. It also specifies anyone who has an instruction permit no matter the age must wear a helmet. Any licensed motorcycle operator who is 18 years old or older can operate a motorcycle without a helmet as long as he/she has insurance which will cover injuries.

This act states that anyone under the age of 18 riding or driving a motorcycle or motortricycle must wear a helmet at all times. Individuals who have a motorcycle instruction permit must wear a helmet when the motorcycle or motortricycle is moving. Licensed motorcycle or motortricycle drivers who are age 18 or older do not have to wear a helmet as long as the individual has medical payment insurance, maintains proof of financial responsibility, and has health insurance to cover medical costs associated with a motorcycle accident.

This bill allows a resident of Missouri to have a medical alert notation placed on his or her driver's license or nondriver's identification card. The bill specifies the medical conditions that may be listed on the license or identification card. The applicant must sign a waiver for the release of medical information and provide a sworn statement with the applicant's diagnosis from a physician or psychologist. Parental consent is required for anyone under 18 years of age. This bill requires the Department of Revenue to transfer the medical information received to the State Highway Patrol for entry into the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES). The applicant is made aware of the transfer of information in the application and consent requests. This bill has a delayed effective date of July 31, 2021.
