This bill places an aggregate cap on the amount of state low-income housing tax credits that may be authorized in a fiscal year. The cap will be the lesser of 72.5% of the amount of federal low-income housing tax credits allocated to the state or \$123 million, adjusted annually for inflation. This bill also reduces the limit on tax credits authorized for projects financed through tax-exempt bonds from \$6 million to \$4 million. To the extent that this limit is not reached in a fiscal year, the amount not authorized may, for such fiscal year only, be added to the amount of tax credits that may be authorized for projects not financed through tax-exempt bond issuance. The Missouri Housing Development Commission will establish an evaluation rubric and score applicants for low-income housing tax credits against the rubric. The Commission will publish the rubric before it accepts applications and must publish the scored rubric for each application. Beginning August 28, 2021, the Commission will establish a pilot program under which low-income housing tax credits may be transferred, sold, or assigned to a third party if so authorized by the commission and elected by the taxpayer, as described in the bill. The amount of tax credits authorized to be transferred must not exceed 15%fifteen percent of the aggregate cap. The pilot program expires on August 28, 2024.

For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2021, this act authorizes a tax credit for certain senior citizens and disabled individuals who experience an increase in the property tax liability on a homestead owned by such taxpayer. To be eligible, the taxpayer shall be at least sixty-five years old or be disabled and have an income equal to or less than \$125,000, adjusted annually for inflation, and shall own a homestead, as defined in the act.

The tax credit authorized by this act shall be equal to the amount by which the property tax liability exceeds the homestead exemption limit. The homestead exemption limit shall be the property tax liability of the taxpayer in the 2020 calendar year or the calendar year in which the taxpayer first becomes eligible for a tax credit under the act, whichever is later. To receive the tax credit, taxpayers shall apply to the Department of Revenue, and such application shall include the taxpayer's age, address, and copies of receipts indicating payment of property tax for the homestead for the three prior tax years.

A taxpayer shall not claim a tax credit under this act if such taxpayer has claimed the Senior Citizen Property Tax Relief Credit (Circuit Breaker) for the same tax year.

The tax credit authorized under this act shall be refundable, but shall not be transferred, sold, or assigned.

This act shall sunset on August 28, 2026, unless reauthorized by the General Assembly.

In addition to existing coverage requirements, the act adds "detectors" to the X-ray equipment specifically listed as being covered under the mandate.

The act also specifies that coverage for certain breast cancer screening and evaluation services shall be provided to any woman deemed by her physician to have an above-average risk for breast cancer in accordance with American College of Radiology (ACR) guidelines, rather than specifically to women with a personal or family history of breast cancer.

The act also requires coverage of any additional or supplemental imaging, such as breast MRI or ultrasound, deemed medically necessary by a treating physician for proper screening or evaluation in accordance with applicable ACR guidelines. Furthermore, the act requires coverage of ultrasound or MRI services when determined by a treating physician to be medically necessary for the screening or evaluation of breast cancer for any woman deemed by the treating physician to have an above-average risk of breast cancer in accordance with ACR guidelines for breast cancer screening.

Lastly, provisions relating to out-of-pocket expenditures are modified to apply to the additional modalities required to be covered under the act.
