This joint resolution proposes an amendment to the MO Constitution stating that medical assistance under MO HealthNet is subject to appropriation and there are no rights, expectations or entitlements without appropriation. It also includes work and community engagement requirements for MO HealthNet participants. Exemptions to the requirements are provided to individuals who are medically frail, have mental disorders which are disabling, have complex medical conditions, have intellectual or developmental disabilities which impairs ability to perform activities of daily living, and a designation of having a permanent or total disability by the Social Security Act and the Department of Social Services. Individuals with disabilities and anyone who has an immediate family member in the home who has a disability can also be granted a good cause exception by the Department of Social Services. It requires the Department to provide reasonable accommodations so individuals can participate in work and community engagement requirements.
