This bill creates the “Public Education Transparency Act”. It has many components. One is not allowing teachers and school administration to make political activism, lobbying, or legislative efforts at the local, state or federal level a part of a course, grade/credit requirement, or extra credit. This includes internships related to social or public policy advocacy. The bill requires that determination of a need for special education placement only be done through the processes and procedures in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

This bill removes from the definition of bullying that the bullying is repetitive or is substantially likely to be repeated. It adds parents to the list of people school districts must receive input from regarding revisions to the district’s anti-bullying policies. Many aspects are stipulated. One is the right to view school curriculum and other educational information. Another is a right to school choice options to select the school, district or local education agency to best suit learning needs. Third, is the right to control a child's health and identifying markers. Also, schools are to make data available showing the percentage of students with disabilities who are scoring at the proficient level or higher on all state assessment tests.

This act also authorizes a state sales tax exemption for the purchase of diapers, as defined in the act. The definition of diapers includes products for bowel and bladder incontinence.
