This bill requires awareness of premenstrual dysphoric disorder to be part of the public school health curriculum in 9^{th} or 10^{th} grade. The requirement would begin in the 2024-2025 school year. The Department of Elementary

and Secondary Education may consult with the Department of Health and Senior Services regarding information that may be included in the instruction.

Under current law, the minimum wage rate is set to increase by \$.85 every year until it reaches \$12.00 per hour in 2023. This act would increase the minimum wage rate by \$1.00 every year beginning in 2024, until the minimum wage rate reaches \$15.00 per hour. The minimum wage rate would thereafter be increased or decreased every year based on the increase or decrease in the Consumer Price Index.

This bill authorizes a tax credit for physicians, advanced practice registered nurses, dentists, and optometrists who practice in rural areas. One of the criteria for qualifying for the tax credit is at least 20% of the professional's practice must be patients with Medicare and at least 15% of the professional's practice must be patients with MO HealthNet. The amount of the tax credit depends on the distance the professional is from a population center in a qualified metropolitan statistical area. It also authorizes a \$250 tax credit for emergency medical technicians working in a rural area. Both tax credits begin January 1, 2024.

HB 842 Burton

Authorizes the Missouri Homestead Preservation Act

This bill creates a tax credit for homestead property owners who are at least 65 years old or who have a disability and have income less than or equal to the maximum upper limit and have not made improvements to the homestead that are more than 5% of the assessed value unless done to accommodate an individual with a disability. Eligibility criteria for couples is included in the bill. Factors that would disqualify taxpayers are specified. One is claiming the property tax credit. It would begin January 1, 2024.

Expands the availability of Missouri empowerment scholarship accounts to qualified students living in counties containing a city with at least thirty thousand inhabitants

This bill makes MO empowerment scholarship accounts available to qualified students who live in counties that have a city with a population of at least 30,000.

Ordinances are required to be passed to implement this. Income limits are allowed to be enacted as part of the ordinances. This begins January 1, 2025.

It requires pharmacies to notify customers upon dispensing a prescription drug that an accessible prescription label is available upon request free of charge. If a customer informs a pharmacy that the individual is blind, visually impaired or has a print disability the pharmacy will affix to the prescription bottle a label which is appropriate to the customer's disability and preferences, lasts for the length of the prescription, as well as follows the best practices of the Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board. The label will include the same information provided to any individual who does not have these disabilities and all information required to comply with state and federal laws. The label will also be provided in a timely manner so that wait times are comparable between customers with and without these disabilities. The pharmacy should also ensure labels are prescription reader compatible if one is provided by the pharmacy.

This act modifies provisions relating to lead poisoning and lead abatement. Currently, when a case of lead poisoning is reported to the Director of the Department of Health and Senior Services by the patient's attending health care professional, the Director informs local health boards and public health agencies as the Director deems necessary. This act repeals this requirement and provides that the Department shall protect the identity of the patient and physician involved in accordance with the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Currently, the Department, in collaboration with the Department of Social Services and other health care organizations, shall develop an educational strategy to increase the number of children who are tested for lead poisoning under the Medicaid program. This act repeals a provision describing the goals and timelines of the educational strategy. Under this act, every health care provider serving children shall annually provide education to all parents and guardians of children less than 4 years of age regarding lead hazards and provide the option to test every child less than 4 years of age with the consent of the parent or guardian. This act repeals provisions requiring all children less than 6 years of age who reside or spend more than 10 hours a week in a high risk area to be annually tested for lead poisoning. Instead, every child less than 6 years of age shall be annually assessed for lead poisoning risk and may be tested with the consent of the child's parent or guardian. Finally, every child care facility located in a geographic area of high risk for lead poisoning shall, within 30 days of enrollment of a child age 12 months to 4 years of age, require the child's parents or guardians to provide evidence of lead poisoning testing or a statement of refusal of such testing.
