HB 2471 Buchheit-Courtway

Modifies provisions governing mental health efforts in public schools

This bill changes the suicide prevention training requirements for public schools beginning with the 2025-2026 school year. It requires that training and guidance on using the Columbia Protocol be included as well as training on the virtual tool described later in the bill designed to assist teachers in helping students use the tool to obtain mental health information, support, and help. It also requires that the school district's policy on youth suicide awareness and prevention training be updated to reflect these additions. The model policy previously developed will also be updated. It enacts Brennan's Law which requires that beginning with the 2024-2025 school year students receive mental health awareness training sometime during fifth through eighth grades. The instruction will be age-appropriate and students with disabilities will participate to the extent possible. It will be provided as part of the health and physical education curriculum based on a Department of Elementary and Secondary Education established program. The bill requires the Department of Mental Health's children's office to develop the virtual tool mentioned earlier in the bill before July 1, 2025.

Beginning January 1, 2025, the true value in money of real property for assessment purposes shall be equal to the most recent purchase price of such real property. Such true value in money shall be the true value in money for all subsequent assessments until the next sale of such property. As specified in the bill, if a homeowner makes additions or improvements to the property, and those additions or improvements increase the value of said property by 50% or more, the homeowner shall notify the assessor. The assessor shall then establish a new assessed valuation, which shall be the true value in money for all subsequent assessments until the next sale of such property. If the sale of a piece of real estate results in a transaction that is below market value, the assessor shall provide evidence to the Board of Equalization or other equivalent entity that such sale price should not be used as the new true value in money for assessment purposes. If a homeowner does not want to participate in the assessed valuation provisions under this bill, such owner may opt out by notifying the assessor's office, and the homeowners' real property shall be assessed under the assessment process in existence on or before December 31, 2024.

This bill allows a county to establish an ordinance allowing a property tax credit for homeowners who are at least 62 years old and not delinquent on property tax credit. The property tax credit set in this bill would apply to certain increases. All taxing entities that levy property taxes are included in this bill. The ordinance will be submitted to the voters. If enough voters are in favor the tax credit would be implemented.

This bill allows the school board of a metropolitan school district to submit to voters a proposal to tax real property to fund special educational services.

- · Oath has failed to be verified;
- · Absentee ballot has been rejected for any other reason provided by law; or
- · Voter is otherwise found disqualified to vote.

If one of the foregoing has been found by the election authority then the ballot shall be rejected and the election authority shall write "REJECTED" on the face of the envelope and give the reason.

The election authority must promptly notify any voter if his or her absentee ballot has been rejected and the deadline and procedures for curing the defect for which the ballot was rejected.

This act is effective January 1, 2025.

This act amends the section of law which was declared unconstitutional in Byrd, et al. v. State of Missouri, et al. This act provides that state funds for homelessness shall be used for certain facilities, including parking areas, camping facilities, and short-term shelters, and shall comply with certain requirements as provided in the act. Additionally, any person that owns or operates a private camping facility pursuant to this act shall be immune from liability as provided in the act. State funds otherwise used for permanent housing projects shall be used to assist individuals with substance use, mental health treatment, and other services like short-term housing. Any state department that is authorized to allocate funds for housing or homelessness shall award certain funds as performance payments for political subdivisions that reduce the number of individuals with days unhoused, days in jail, or days hospitalized. This act provides that no person shall be permitted to use state-owned lands for unauthorized sleeping, camping, or long-term shelters. Any violation shall be a Class C misdemeanor; however the first offense shall be a warning with no citation. A political subdivision shall not adopt any policy under which the political subdivision prohibits the enforcement of any ordinance prohibiting public camping, sleeping, or obstruction of sidewalks. The Attorney General shall have the power to bring a civil action to enjoin the political subdivision from failing to enforce provisions of this act. Any political subdivision with a higher per-capita homelessness rate than the state average according to the U.S. Census and Department of Housing and Urban Development data shall receive no further state funding until the department awarding the funds determines the political subdivision has a lower homelessness rate than the state average or it enforces ordinances prohibiting unauthorized sleeping and camping. This act shall not apply to shelters for domestic violence victims.
