Eligibility as a young child with a developmental delay is allowed to continue when the child is kindergarten or first grade age if the child was identified as a young child with a developmental delay before age nine. The category should not be used to determine whether the student continues to be eligible for special education services if a student is nine years old before August 1. Only the section related to people with disabilities is summarized. This bill provides a personal property tax exemption for motor vehicles the January following the passage of an amendment to the MO Constitution authorizing it. The bill also reduces the assessment percentage of tangible personal property over a period of years. The amounts are specified.

For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2026, this act authorizes a taxpayer to claim a tax credit in an amount equal to federal mileage reimbursement rate, but not to exceed \$3,000, for providing qualified transportation as a volunteer driver, as such terms are defined in the act, for a not-for-profit organization. The amount of the tax credit shall be adjusted annually for inflation. Tax credits authorized by the act shall not be refundable and shall not be transferred, sold, or assigned, but may be carried forward for three tax years. Under this act, such persons shall instead be screened for sexually transmitted diseases prior to incarceration, with the costs for juveniles tested to be paid for by the county in which the offense occurred. This act modifies several provisions of law relating to infection control procedures by replacing HIV or HBV (hepatitis B virus) with "serious infectious or communicable diseases". Under this act, the election authority is required to notify the voter that the envelope is missing information by all means reasonably calculated to make contact with the voter. The voter

must be permitted an opportunity to supply the missing information by completing a new statement and delivering it to the election authority by any means authorized by law for delivering absentee ballots. The Secretary of State is responsible for developing an affidavit form to be used for such purposes. The act expressly prohibits changing any selections made on the ballot contained within the ballot envelope. Only the office of the election authority is permitted to contact voters pursuant to this act. Voters have until the close of polls on election day to supply missing information on the absentee ballot envelope. If a voter fails to supply the missing information prior to that time, the absentee ballot shall be rejected. Current law permits election authorities to prepare absentee ballots for tabulation not earlier than the fifth day prior to the election. This act repeals the five day limitation and permits preparation of absentee ballots for tabulation upon receipt. The act repeals a provision stipulating that absentee ballots that are received by an LEA in person are deemed cast when received prior to the closing of polls. Furthermore, the repealed provision provides that absentee ballots received by the LEA through a common carrier such as the United States Postal Service are required to be received prior to the time fixed by law for the closing of polls on election day.

This bill specifies that in the case of benefits administered by the Railroad Retirement Board, the Social Security Administration, or the Veterans Administration, the Children's Division is required to determine whether a child in custody of the Division is receiving or otherwise eligible to receive such benefits within 60 days after placement into custody. The Division is to apply for benefits on behalf of the child, if the child is deemed to be eligible, and if benefits are already being received before placement into the Division's custody or the Division applies for benefits on behalf of the child, the Division is responsible for identifying a representative payee and must apply to become such if no other suitable candidate is available. Any moneys received by the Division and in the account of a child are prohibited from being expended by the Division for certain services or care. However, this bill provides that the Division may use the benefits administered by the Railroad Retirement Board, the Social Security Administration, or the Veterans Administration for the child's unmet needs, as are defined in the bill, beyond what the Division is required or agrees to pay.
