This bill increases the amount of rent which constitutes property taxes paid to \$1,055 and the amount of actual property taxes paid to \$1,550 when determining the property tax credit for tax years beginning January 1, 2026. The amounts will be adjusted annually based on inflation. The bill also increases the maximum upper limit to \$38,200 or \$42,200 for an individual depending on the situation. The amounts will be adjusted annually based on inflation. There are also specified amount exemptions. The table used to calculate the amount of property tax credit to be received is updated.
